





Sustainable horse management on small properties – community field days

The Molonglo Catchment Group invites you to attend one of four community field days on "Sustainable horse management on small properties" in early 2012. These field days are being implemented with assistance from the NSW Environmental Trust.

Jane Myers (Equiculture, expert on horse management and author of "Managing Horses on Small Properties") together with Alison Elvin (Natural Capital, local expert on weed and pasture management) will provide specific horse, pasture and weed management advice relevant to your property.

Each field day includes:

- 1) Presentation of sustainable horse properties including good and bad examples to provide participants with some firm ideas about how to design their own properties.
- 2) Discussion of property layouts brought in by participants and provide some advice on how best to set them up, so don't forget to bring in a printed aerial photo of your property or a digital copy on a USB stick.
- 3) Field trip to a local property to discuss property planning principles. This will consist of a walk-and-talk, drawing on key points from the morning session. Local weed and pasture management expert **Alison Elvin** will be on hand for this session to field questions about our local weeds and pasture issues.

Please bring:

- Aerial photo of your property either a hard or digital (eg Google Earth, on USB stick) copy
- Pen and paper for the morning session
- A hat, sunscreen, water, sturdy shoes and wet weather gear for afternoon session
