RECOGNISING WATER WEEDS Workshop

This workshop has been developed to allow participants' to improve their skills in water weed identification. Participants will develop skills and knowledge to improve their understanding and management of water weeds. Live plant specimens are used to outline key identification features to distinguish between native look-a-likes and noxious weeds.

What is covered in the Recognising Water Weeds training workshop?

This 1 day workshop will provide participants with skills and knowledge relating to water weeds including:

- Water weed habitats including common areas where aquatic weeds invade
- Impacts & vectors of spread
- Legislation requirements
- Recognising plant characteristics
- Correctly dispose of aquatic plant material
- Early detection survey guidelines



Each participant will receive a:

- Participant workbook
- A Resource CD
- RWW Plant Identification field guide (glossy A5 size)
- Survey guidelines for weed professional & community groups

Who should attend?

This workshop is designed for weed professionals or people working in natural resource management who require knowledge of water weed species as part of their employment.

Workshop numbers will be limited to 25 participants.



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Accreditation

This workshop provides participants with the opportunity to undertake formal assessment tasks during the workshop. You may or may not choose to be assessed. This is a Nationally accredited course.
